First, Seeadler: Whilst en route to the BYC for the start of this year's race, Captain Bill Read and his son Bill saw a man who had been thrown from his boat swimming for his life in the middle of Buzzards Bay, one and one half miles from shore. He was rescued, brought aboard Seeadler, and the Coast Guard called. The Coast Guard subsequently attended and took the man ashore. Had Seeadler's crew not rescued the swimmer, he almost certainly would have drowned.

Second, Talisman: At the request of the Coast Guard, she switched on her engine and motor sailed away from the race course to search for the source of a flare that was spotted by her and several other boats. After approximately two hours, she resumed racing upon advice of the Coast Guard who believed the "flare" must have been a meteoroid.
